

“We Ain’t Buying It,” and Onward!

The goal of the Nov 27 to Dec 1 boycott, “**We Ain’t Buying It,**” is to show Target, Home Depot, and Amazon what we can and will do to oppose their assisting the Trump Administration in removing DEI or terrorizing law-abiding immigrants. It also sends a message to other compliant corporations, even if they aren’t actively being boycotted at this time.

Please also support the Starbucks worker’s strike. Don’t patronize Starbucks coffee shops until the Starbucks Workers Union has gained a decent contract, something Starbucks has so far refused to negotiate.

And buy local if you can, but if you’re on too tight a budget, there are other ways to avoid Target, Home Depot, and Amazon, and sometimes find less expensive prices while you’re at it.

There’s no reason to stop the boycott after December 1. Buy local all the time if you can!
